

Home and School Volunteerism Award

This award is presented to an Eighth Grade student who demonstrates the importance of service to Church, School, and Community through volunteerism.

Who is eligible?

Any eighth grader who:

- has engaged in volunteer activity that occurred during the 12 months prior to the date of application
- submits a completed application to the Home and School Executive Board by March 31 of that school year
- completes an essay describing the impact volunteering has had on his/her life

What qualifications must be met?

The applicant must:

- complete at least 30 hours of volunteer service in the community (volunteer hours required by other service organizations such as Scouts, Legion of Mary, school assignments, etc. will not count toward this requirement)
- provide signed documentation of these completed hours

A resource list will be available upon request from the Home and School Board for volunteer service opportunities.

What does the honoree win?

The student chosen for the award will receive a \$500 saving bond, \$250 in cash, and a certificate.

Who determines the winner?

The Home and School Executive Board will determine the winner based on verified volunteer hours and essay. The Executive Board consists of the pastor, principal, vice-principal, president, vice-president, secretary, and treasurer.
